This investment is essential to ensure uninterrupted service, meet modern environmental standards, and safeguard the substantial water quality gains made over the past decades.

This is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it supports essential infrastructure in a rural community, protecting public health and the environment. The Village of Marathon's wastewater system is vital for preventing raw sewage contamination in local rivers, which feed into the Chesapeake Bay. Investing in this project ensures continued compliance with health and safety regulations, prevents costly crises, and supports maintaining infrastructure in a rural community.

This project has a federal nexus because the funding is for the purposes authorized in Section 306 of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, 7 U.S. Code section 1926(a)(2).
